### SERMON RECAP

Obadiah was written (i.e. spoken) at a time when the people of faith were having a hard time believing in God. Entering their story and hearing the message of this book can help us understand why it's sometimes hard to believe in God, and it gives us something to believe in.

Obadiah's prophecy announces the climax in the story of twin brothers that figure prominently into the overall story of the Bible—Jacob and Esau. We first meet these two brothers before they were even born because they started fighting in their mother's womb. Jacob's descendants became Israel. Esau's became Edom.

Edom's history is significant in Israel's. They are relatives of Israel, and they epitomize the antagonism of the nations toward God's people. The climactic offense of Edom against Israel is the subject of the book of Obadiah. Babylon had destroyed Jerusalem and scattered the Israelites, and Edom came in to further loot and destroy Israel in the wake of Babylon. Rather than rallying to their brothers' side, despite their rivalry, when a greater enemy arrived, the Edomites kicked their brother while he was down.

Having humbled Israel, he restores them, keeping his promise of the inheritance of people, place and rule. But God wipes out Edom, who clung to their pride and vengeance. In the end, the kingdom (dominion) will be the Lord's.
